'GET READY' PREPAREDNESS TRAINING

CERT TRAINING

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training provides



citizens with the basic skills needed to respond to their community's immediate needs after a disaster as well as during minor emergencies. After making sure you, your family and your neighborhood are safe, you may be asked to help out in another neighborhood. The course consists of six 2½-hour sessions and a final 6-hour session at which participants participate in "hands-on" exercises to demonstrate the skills they have learned.

NEIGHBORHOOD NETWORK

The Burlingame Neighborhood Network encourages citizens to work together in neighborhoods to prepare for disasters by gathering data about skills and equipment that will be helpful during an emergency. In the process of getting better acquainted, neighbors are inspired to plan events such as block parties and holiday get-togethers. Their sense of community fosters a Neighborhood Watch awareness that helps prevent crime. Block captains are invited to quarterly meetings to meet one another, share information and hear city updates. CRIME PREVENTION AND NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Neighbors can band together to emphasize crime prevention by establishing a

Neighborhood Watch group. The program trains citizens to become aware of suspicious activity in their neighborhoods and to report such activities immediately, thereby serving as the eyes and ears of the Police Department. An officer from the Burlingame Police Department will come to your neighborhood meeting to provide tips and handouts on home security, personal security, bicycle safety, drug awareness, stranger danger and other topics.
