0	Recruit neighbors via flyers and email  • Sample flyers at BurlingameNetwork.org under Resources > Drill Materials > Drill Lead Resources	Now thru September

8	Identify your Incident Commander (IC) and Communications Lead (or choose these and other Lead roles on the Drill morning) Communications people should download and familiarize themselves with the Zello phone app and/or the FRS radios. 4	Join the Drill Walk-Through for Drill Leads  • We'll show you how to run your Drill  • Neighbors welcome  • Pick up your lawn sign	September 18, Thursday 7-8:30 pm, Burlingame Community Center
6	Join the Communications Workshop  • Invite your block's Incident Commander (IC) and Communications Lead (if those roles are known)	September 25, Thursday 7-8:30 pm, Burlingame Community Center
6	Continue recruiting neighbors (minimum 8 needed)  Review Drill Kit and read the script  Choose 8-10 scenarios you like	A few days before
7	Remind your participants and request RSVP  • Sample email at <i>BurlingameNetwork.org</i> under Resources > Drill Materials > Drill Lead Resources  • Gather Drill Kit materials, Cache duffle contents, and any props	A few days before
